PRIORITY ACTION PLAN - TRAFFIC

To achieve our priorities, within an overall Strategic Management approach, it is of primary importance that:

- Parish Council, our PDC Councillor and DCC Councillor lobby to ensure that Bere Regis plans are included in the DCC Local Transport Plan.
- A traffic consultation for Bere Regis, by independent traffic experts, is instigated, to consider: Rerouting (including consideration of a southern by-pass), reducing heavy traffic, traffic calming, parking, one-way systems and problem areas. Detailed commissioned studies of traffic issues associated with: West Street/North Street and Elder Road/Manor Farm Road, should be carried out.
