Traffic Survey

Triggered by a number of incidents in recent years, we have formed a Traffic Focus group to look at traffic issues within the village. Speeding is clearly a significant concern, but other issues include parking problems, antisocial or nuisance driving, traffic volumes, road maintenance & markings, lighting and pedestrian safety.

We need your help both to confirm known problems, and to identifying other issues, to enable us to pressure the appropriate authorities for change. We know we can't make many, if any, traffic related changes ourselves but if we are seeking to change speed limits, improve signage, request new road marking etc, then community support is vital.
